

Summer Packing List

Well-labeled clothing and items help campers return home with all of their belongings. Sending a checklist with your camper will help them remember what to take back as they pack to return home.

No electronic devices (including phones) are allowed at camp. If found, these items will be held in the office until the end of the camp session. The Pines does not tolerate alcohol, drugs, or weapons, including Swiss Army knives. Outside food/drinks, personal sports equipment, vehicles, and animals are not permitted.

To Pack:

- 7 pairs of shorts (girls' shorts must be a modest length)
- 7 t-shirts (no clothing with profanity, sexuality, drug/alcohol reference or subject matter in direct conflict with Church teaching) Tanktops are allowed, but no spaghetti straps
- 7 pairs (or more) of underwear and socks
- Pajamas or sleepwear
- 2 one-piece swimsuits for girls, 2 pairs of swim trunks for boys
- Raingear
- Sunglasses
- Cap or hat
- 2 pairs of comfortable, close-toed/athletic shoes
- Sleeping bag and/or sheets and blanket (twin-size mattress)
- Pillow
- Bath towel(s), beach towel, and wash cloth
- Personal hygiene items (soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.)
- Shower caddy
- Shower shoes/flip flops
- Drawstring backpack for 8th-12th grade boys
- Insect repellent
- Water bottle (labeled with camper name)
- Flashlight and batteries
- Laundry bag/ plastic bags (for dirty or wet clothes and towels)
- Bible
- White t-shirt (for tie dye)
- Tissues
- Books or card games for rest hour
- Stamps, paper, pens, pre-addressed envelopes (to write letters home)
- Disposable camera

Medication

Both over-the-counter and prescription medication must be in original containers and placed in a labeled, resealable plastic bag. Please send only the amount of medication needed to last the duration of your camper's stay at camp. Please do not send their entire supply.

Razors

Shaving razors may be brought to camp, but will be kept under lock and key. Campers may have access to their razors by simply requesting permission from their counselor.
